MASKS

Masks are currently optional on campus. There may be instances at the beginning of the semester, after holiday breaks, or when an individual has had exposure to COVID-19 where a mask may be required for a pre-determined duration of time.

VACCINES

There are currently no COVID-19 vaccine requirements to attend Summit. Individuals are encouraged to make medical decisions with their physician to make the best choice for their circumstances.

EXPOSURE PROTOCOL

Individuals who have been exposed to a positive case are asked to wear a mask in public spaces on campus, keep socially distant from others where feasible, and monitor their symptoms for 5 days after exposure.

ISOLATION PROTOCOL

Individuals who test positive for COVID-19 will need to isolate for a pre-determined number of days. We will continue to monitor evolving CDC and State guidelines for isolation period recommendations.

ACADEMIC ACCOMODATIONS

Appropriate academic accommodations may be made during periods of isolation or quarantine including, but not limited to, access to class recordings or make up days.

CLEANING PROTOCOLS

Campus facilities will be cleaned and sanitized on a frequent and regular basis.
